Before the work is published, it is reviewed by other expert researchers. These “**peer-reviewers**” look at the quality of the work, the originality of the research and the credibility of the research findings. This is to make sure that work is completed to a high standard.

These articles are specifically written for academics and professionals working in the field of research. Because of the audience, sometimes the work in these journals are explained in a complicated manner.
